California has been largely spared from the virus. At this writing, the total number of deaths in the six-county Southern California metropolitan area (including San Diego) is 202, and in the nine-county Bay Area it's 89.

It appears that the virus likes cold weather. 70% of the deaths to date are north of the Mason-Dixon line (from Maryland to the Northern California/Oregon border).

In terms of employment and unemployment, March was much better than anticipated. The U.S. lost 701,000 jobs, less than a half of a percent of the 155 million jobs in the nation. The unemployment rate crept up to 4.4%. Not so bad.
